DEPARTMENT OF ISLAMIC STUDIES COURSE DESCRIPTION (B. A.)

Sh Is 101:Family System in Islam

Concept, and aims of the family in Islamic thought planning for raising the family through choosing the spouse, engagement, and marriage contract (conditions, constituents, material and moral effects; dissolution of marital bonds and forms and their effects with special emphasis on some problems and challenges facing the family.

Sh Is102: Basic Islamic Concepts

The concept of moderation in Islamic Faith, Law, ethics and civilization, and the effect of that in achieving justice, security and encountering extremism.

Sh Is 110:Introduction to the Foundations of Islamic Education

Basics that should be well and adequately understood by Islamic education students such as concept of education, Islamic education, and its characteristics, aims, fields and position.

Sh Is 130:Introduction to Islamic Dawahand Communication

Da'wah science and its relation to Islamic sciences; elements of the Da'wah, history and development of Da'wah; foundation and means of Da'wah, Role of Islamic Communication in Da'wah and in solving the problems of the Musilm Ummah.

Sh Is 132: Callers Code of Ethics and Conduct

Study of the general theoretical foundations of ethics such as commitment, responsibility and retribution; analytical study of methods of Da'wah based on Quran, sunnah and Shabbat's lives.

Sh Is 170:Muslim World at Present

Spread of Islam and Muslims in the world; analytical study of contemporary Muslim conditions in all respects and fields, exposition of the causes of the present economic and civilizational deterioration and their political and military defeats; investigation of ways and means that could lead muslims towards a better future; study of main Muslim issues and the problems facing muslim minorities

Sh Is 200:Research Methods and Sources of Islamic Studies

Importance, aims and methods of research starting from the problem and ending up with solutions; steps to be taken to accomplish a successful research work including fundaments of research, documentation and writing; rules manuscript editing and dealing with sources; theoretical introduction and practical training in handling sources of Islamic studies.

Sh Is 201: The Educational meanings of Prophetic Traditions studyinga group of prophetic Traditions in order to discover their educational meanings related to the individual, family, and society. This should be carried out in the light of rhetoric and other related Traditions.

Sh Is 213: The institutions of Islamic Institutions:

Introduction of educational institution and its role in building up the individual. It also discusses the development of the institution, and studying the role of sosque, Quran mchools, Universities, and media institutions in educating the generations.

Sh Is 220:Rules and Ethics of Muslim Home

Rules, conditions, facilities, and conveniences of Muslim homes; ethics of privacy; looking and asking permission; decorum rules of good manners; sleep; travel; visits and social relations.

Sh Is 221: Children's Rights and Rules in Islam

Children's pre-birth and after birth; material rights; support, children's rights in international law and Sharia (Muslim Canon law) particularly in Jordanian law.

Sh Is 230:Preparation and Training of Preachers

Providing preachers with academic, linguistic, educational, and cultural training; practical preparations; qualities necessary for muslim preacher, and media issues.

Sh Is 235:Methods of Da'wah

Methods of Da'wah; types and aims; (emotional rational, sensory etc.), characteristics of Da'wh; some leading Preachers.

Sh Is240: Educational Studies in the Family's Quranic and Prophetic

Studying the educational meanings of Quranic and Prophetic texts related to the Family , and their effect of educating children Women.

Sh Is 241:Studies in Islamic Psychology

Concepts, research methods, aims and functions of psychology; teaching; intelligence; psychological realism; personality, disturbances and treatment; adjustment of behavior; development; comparative study of psychology and Islamic perspective of such issues.

Sh Is 311:Patterns of Islamic Education

Patterns of Islamic education and their authentication from Quran and sunnah; highlighting the role of Islamic education in providing contemporary education with the psychological and educational frameworks lacked by the latter; this is done by dealing with the attitude of Islamic education, towards the mental, health and physical, sexual, environmental, spiritual and social educational patterns.

Sh Is 316:Teaching and Preaching Methods

Providing students with Islamic Sharia sciences teaching skills in terms of formulating Sharia sciences educational aims, and planning for the classroom situation; procedures of teaching the branches of Sharia sciences such as recitation, exegesis, hadith, Aqideh, Fiqh and Sirah; teaching methods including dialogue and discussion, problem solving, cooperative teaching; questioning; teaching of concepts, values and story; investigation and projects; applied model lessons for each of the above teaching methods.

Sh Is 318: Basics of Educational Administration in Islam.

The concept of school, calss, and educational administration, and studying the most important modern theories in these fields, and from the Islamic point of view. It discusses also the muslim education list's characteristics.

Sh Is 319: Public address and Preacing

Introducing public address and its history, preparing the modern public address, its modern trends, its types, and its rules. It also disusses the mosque message in society.

Sh IS 320: Studies in Women's Figh

Jurisprudence rules pertaining to women to the exclusion of men whether in the field of Ibadat (religious observances) including ritual purity; menstruation; parturition; rules of prayer, fasting, Zakat (ritual alms) and hajj (ritual pilgrimage); personal statute including dowery, khul' (divorce at the instance of the wife), Zihar (a pre-Islamic form of divorce); inheritance; transactions; penalties; jihad; study of Quranic and Sunnah texts related to women.

Sh Is 322: Family and Contemporary Challenges

Major problems and challenges facing the family: educational, cultural or social challenges e.g. choosing spouses, role of legal guardians, endogamy, exorbitant dowers, high costs of marriage and aversion of youths to marriage, problems related to child raising, divorce problems and how Islam tackles them; aged people and how to shelter them; globalizations challenges, information and communication revolutions and family role in dealing with them.

Sh Is 324: Human Growth and its educational requirements in Islam:

The concept of human growth in Islam, its principles, the factors effecting it, and the methodology of growth phenomenas. It also discusses the stages of human growth in Quran and sunnah.

Sh IS 330: News Making in Islam

News ,definition, elements, values , sources Writing, news censorship and analysis and dissimination models .

Sh IS 331: Modern Means of Communication

Radio, press ,television , satellite channelstv, Internet leaflet posters etc; role of means of communication in conveying the message all of Islam to the masses , and in defending Islam against specious arguments .

Sh Is 333: Islamic Da'wah Personalities:

Selected Figures throughout the ages such as $\,$ ibn al- Musayyib , Ibn Taymiyah, al- Izz Ibn Abdul – Salam , Ibn Badis , Al- Nadams , Al – Banna Rashed Reda , Muhammad Abdu , Muhammad Ibn Abdul Wahhab etc; and studying them in the light of the general sources and characteristics of their Islamic Da'wah and the role they played there in.

Sh Is 334: Programs and institutions of Religious media:

The basics and principles of religious media programs, the objective methods of preparing them, introduction to the concept of religious media institution.

Sh Is 401A: Trends of Islamic educational thought

The concept of Islamic educational Thought, its characteristics, sources, principles, its duties, and its attitude of modern educational thought.

Sh Is 402: The educational meanings of Islamic Faith

The effects of Islamic Faith in the educational and psychological situation of the individual and society.

Sh Is 403: Studies in Muslim Sociology

Introduction of basic concepts of sociology and the Quranic and the prophetic view of society. It also disusses of sociological concepts of Islamic thought in the light of Ibn Khaldoun's introduction.

Sh Is 411: Readings in Islamic Educational Heritage `

Definition of heritage in general and Islamic educational heritage in particular, methodology of dealing with Islamic educational heritage problems related to that . establishment of a fully aware scientific methodology, a collection of heritage educational readings representing the stages through which the various schools of Islamic educational thought has passed like the works of – Zarnougi , Ibn Sahnun , al Ghazali , Farabi, ibn Sina , Ibn Khaldun , Jamal Al – Din Al – Afghani , Muhammad Abdu etc .

Sh Is 412: Islamic Education Methodologies

Concept, objectives, aims and characteristics of Islamic education, Islamic education teacher and his /her Qualities and qualifications; methodical processes that Islamic education in Jordan has passed in terms of planning, development, execution and evaluation; bases of Islamic education curricula and constituents in Jordan.

Sh Is 421A: Prominent Muslim Women

Analytical study of a number of women who had a tremendous impact on the progress of Islamic civilization as holy warriors, scholars, worshippers, poetesses, and educators.

Sh IS 422: Women's Rights in Systems and Legislations

A study of the situation of women in various phases of modern life through a comparative approach. Women Rights, duties and social aspects of their position in Jordanian legislation and international conventions and in comparison with various legislations including Islamic law.

Sh Is 431: Islam in Western Media

Image of Islam, Muslims and Arabs in general in the western media: essence and causes; contemporary Islamic discourse as viewed by westerners; evaluation of this image; how to correct and promote it.

Sh Is 432: Psychological Warfare in Islam

Definition of Da'wah; propaganda; psychological warfare and other related terms; aims, types, means, ways of encounter; its impact on the masses in peace and war; the Islamic perspective; practical examples from Quran, Sunah and sirah (Prophet Muhammad's life).

Sh Is 433: Selected Texts from Islamic Studies in English

Analyzing Islamic texts in English with a view to enriching the students abilities in vocabulary and structure related to Sharia subjects, including Aqidah, Hadith, Fiqh, etc.

Course Description of Master's Degree Program in Islamic Education

Sh Is 601 Research Methods in Islamic Studies

Academic researches, Main methodologies of academic research: inductive, deductive (Figh foundations methodology), historic, descriptive, experimental and manuscripts, preparation of the research project plan and the plan thereof, collection of academic material, report writing, wording of the reheard, research instruments, research assessment criteria, practical application in preparation, writing and discussion of researches in the fields of all Islamic studies (Fiqh jurisprudence), Usul Addin (foundations of religion) and Islamic Education.

Sh Is 602 Islamic Education Foundations and Principles,

Concept and importance of educational foundations, study of Islamic Education Foundations: belief, devotional, intellectual, historical, legislative, ethical, psychological, economic and political foundations; educational principle: concept and deduction thereof, major principles of Islamic education through Quran, and Sunnah and the practical application, tawhid (morotheism) principle, learning, reward and punishment, objectivity, equality, Shura (mutual consultation), justice, equal opportunity individual differences, responsibility.

Sh Is 610 Islamic Education Curricula and Teaching Methods

Introduction to educational curriculum: concept, bases, principles of planning and development. Analysis of Islamic Education curricula and textbooks in the basic and secondary schools in the light of the aims of teaching Islamic Education, planning of Islamic Education lessons and the techniques and methods of teaching, planning Islamic Education lessons and utilization of educational technologies and activities in teaching Islamic Education and applied demonstrations In teaching procedures of teaching branches of Islamic Education, test and evaluation designing, major capacities of the Islamic Education teacher.

Sh Is 611 Development of Islamic Educational Thought

Educational thought and elements thought stages of educational thoght development throughout the ages (Arabs before Islam, age of prophet Muhammad and the Orthodox caliphs, Umayyal, Abbasid, Ottoman and present periods), educational contribution of muslim educationists in each period within the circles of Figh (jurisprudence), Ilm al-Kalam (scholastic theology, Sufism etc. linking of intellectual efforts with foundations of Sharia and the social context which witnessed the birth of opinions and ideas and reflection of thought on the educational institutions that existed them.

Sh Is 612 Educational Texts from Quran, Sunnah and Tradition

Study and analysis of educational texts chosen from the Quran and reliable sources of sunnah, sayings of Sahabah (Prophet Muhammad's Companions) and other followers, training the students in deducing positive and negative educational values and principles of application of modern educational objectives taxonomy to those texts.

Sh Is 614: Educational Administration in Islam

Concept, rise; importance and most significant schools of educational administration, fundamentals of educational administration, (planning, organization, direction, incentives, evaluation, supervision), comparative and Sharia authenticated analytical study, traditional and contemporary applied models of Islamic educational administration (Administration of the Nizamiyyah School, al-Zaitunah, al Azhar etc..).

Sh Is 622 Preparation and Development of the Teacher from an Islamic Perspective

Teacher's status and educational role,bases of teacher's preparation from various personal, academic and professional sides according to Islamic perspectives. Development of the teacher's performance and enhancement of his practical and technical skills, teacher incentive system in Islamic thought, study of specimens of teacher preparation literature in Islamic through the writings of some leading scholars such all at Nuwawi, at Ghazzali an ibn Sahnun in addition to some contemporary researches in this field.

Sh Is 626 Educational Systems in the Muslim World

Selection of a number of (Arab and non-Arab) Muslim counties for getting acquainted with the educational and teaching systems in each; problems faced by these systems plus a comparison between them in the light of the cultural contexts which each system lived or is living through, showing similarities and dissimilarities.

Sh Is 630 Islamic Authentication of Human and Social Sciences

Meaning of Islamic Authentication of sciences, the role of Islamic authentication of sciences in the civilizational al progress of the nation; the cognitive model on which human and social sciences are based in Muslim countries at present, western knowledge effective elements in terms of their impact on the present cognitive models, in Muslim countries, fundamentals of the Islamic cognitive models, some experiences in Islamic authentication of sciences in recent years e.g (political science, economy, sociology, education psychology and evaluation necessary steps for the Islamic authentication process).

Sh Is 632 Islamic Educational Institutions

Concept of the educational and teaching institution, role of educational institutions in the educational process (mans' development and upbringing), raising, development and curricula of Islamic educational institutes; contemporary Islamic institutions, (family, low elementary schools (kuttabs), school, university, mosque, media, non-governmental societies, civil society institutions, clubs, various social institutions), optimal model of Islamic educational institutions.

Sh Is 633: Educational Meanings in the Quraince and prophetic texts.

Educational study of a number of Quranic and Prophetic texts in the light of the revelation causes and the rhetoric principles of Arabic.

Sh Is 696: Graduation Project

Certain titles related to Islamic education are discussed so the student would have one of them to write up his graduation thesis. The supervisor will take care of the research process, and firally a committee specialized in Islamic education will make sure of the research outcome.

Faculty of Sharia and Islamic Studies Study plan for Ph. D. Degree in Islamic Education
